Prospective High School Rodeo Member:

Thank you for your inquiry of Texas High School Rodeo – Region 1. Our area covers the Texas Panhandle, but we also have members from Eastern New Mexico, the Oklahoma Panhandle, Western Oklahoma and Southeastern Colorado.

One thing that makes our region unique from the rest of the Texas program is the Tri-State High School Rodeo Association. Tri-State covers the same area and is the backbone for high school rodeo in the Texas Panhandle. This year all of our rodeos are co-approved for both associations. It is your choice which association you join – many current members compete for both. The chart below compares the two associations:

Scholarships	5 - \$1000 scholarships were awarded in 2009 through the Tri-State High School Rodeo Association Memorial Scholarship Fund.	In the past two years, over \$20,000 was awarded to Region 1 members through the Texas High School Rodeo Association. Amounts ranged from \$400 to \$3500.
Entry fees	Boys events: bb, sb & br - \$39 cr, rr, sw - \$34 Girls events: ba, pl, gt - \$32 bk - \$34 Team roping: \$29 per run Office charge is \$9 per rodeo.	All events are \$25 each with a \$5 office charge per rodeo. No ribbon roping. Cutting events sponsored by Panhandle Cutting Horse Association & Palo Duro Cutting Horse Association.
Team Roping	Members may enter up to two times (with different partners.) Only two loops allowed.	Only one run allowed. Held in conjunction with Tri-State team roping. Tri-State team must designate which run will be used for Region 1.

Members who compete in both associations pay two separate entry fees for each rodeo. In turn, there are two separate payoffs and two separate point totals.
